## Welcome

Welcome to St. John's Episcopal Church. Whether you are passing through or looking for a church home, we are honored by your presence and we invite you to worship with us fully—singing, praying and receiving communion. We are a multigenerational community that strives to serve Christ through invitation, inclusion, faith and action. Most Sundays we have two services: a contemplative 7:45 a.m. service and a choral service at 10:00 a.m.

**Children are welcome at all services.** Children's coloring bulletins, books and crayons are available near the back of the sanctuary. Children in PreK – 4th grade are invited to their own children's worship service upstairs at 10:00 a.m. and will return to the sanctuary for communion. Nursery is available for infants and toddlers beginning at 9:45 a.m. until noon.

All are welcome to receive communion at St. John's. This includes children of all ages. At the 7:45 service we gather around the altar. For the later services we have communion in stations, the right side for the bread and the left side is for the wine. We receive the Body of Christ, the bread, in our outstretched hands. Wine will be available to all who wish to take it via the common cup. If you do not wish to receive any part of the communion you may still come forward for a blessing. Crossing your hands over your chest lets us know you wish to receive a blessing.

#### Land Acknowledgment:





The Gospel Mark 16:1-8

Gospeler The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint Jesus. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." 

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Yes, it is always right to thank you, God. Thank you for making the world: sunlight and nighttime, rivers, rocks and seas, birds and animals, plants and people.

#### Thank you for your whole world!

And thank you, God, for giving us Jesus, Your son and Mary's son, the good shepherd, and our brother.

### Thank you for Jesus Christ, our Lord.


And thank you, God, for the good news Jesus brought: good news for poor people made strong, and sick people made well; good news of blessing for children, and a feast for everyone.

#### Thank you for this good news!

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.

Celebrant The Gifts of God for the People of God. All are welcome.

All are welcome to receive Holy Communion at the altar.

You may consume the bread and then drink from the cup, or you may choose to receive bread only.

If you do not wish to receive communion, you are welcome to come forward for a blessing,

indicated by crossing your arms over your chest.




